The Governing Body of the City of Sublette, Kansas met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Lawrence Hoerman presiding and the following members of the City Council present: James Barber, Leon Birney, Tom Stoppel and Jason Vaughn. Also present were City Superintendent Daylen Elsey, Sheriff Troy Briggs, Attorney Lynn Koehn, and City Clerk Jeannie Trigg. Visitors were Lona DuVall, Janie Welsh, Chuck Young, Tina Stoppel and Greg Stoppel.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were approved as distributed with a motion made by Councilmember Stoppel, seconded by Councilmember Birney. The motion carried 4-0.

Lona DuVall, President and CEO of Finney County Economic Development Corporation, was present to discuss RHID (Rural Housing Incentive District) with the Council

Chuck Young, Christian Church Pastor, was present to ask permission to block off Carson Street from Cody Street East to alley on Wednesday, July 14th from 4:00 to 10:00 p.m. It was the consensus of the Council to allow them to block it off.

Sheriff Troy Briggs was present to give the monthly law enforcement report. He reported on Fireworks. He gave the status on the Highway 83 project.

Greg Stoppel was present to discuss with the Council housing development; sewer and water lines.

Superintendent Elsey gave the monthly water report. He discussed with the Council the purchase of a pool robotic sweeper; due to lack of availability the Council tabled the purchase.

Mayor Hoerman informed the Council that FireChief Sherwood told him the two radios were in. A bill for \$3,850.00 was submitted by Kendall Brown for welding on tanker truck. A motion was made by Councilmember Birney, seconded by Councilmember Stoppel to approve payment. The motion carried 4-0.

A motion was made by Councilmember Vaughn, seconded by Councilmember Birney to approve and allow payment of the bills as distributed. The motion carried 4-0.

Councilmember Barber made a motion to adjourn at 8:41 p.m., seconded by Councilmember Birney. The motion carried 4-0.
