Debbie Brown, County Emergency Management, was present to talk with the Council about concerns of West Nile Virus and spraying mosquitos. She also discussed the Ordinance requiring house numbers on resident's houses.

Mary and Andy Cauthon were present to discuss their property nuisance

Lexi Wright was present to talk to the Council about establishing a Little Free Library. A lending library, with boxes for books put in various spots around the City.

Sheriff Troy Briggs was present to give the monthly law enforcement report. He reported on doings and happenings within the City. He reported that fair week went well.

Fire Chief Rusty Sherwood was present to give the monthly fire report.

Superintendent Elsey gave the monthly water report. He discussed the need to plant some trees in the City parks. A motion was made by Councilmember Barber, seconded by Councilmember Birney to allow \$1500.00 to buy trees. The motion carried 5-0. He discussed chip sealing in early September.
