The Governing Body of the City of Sublette, Kansas met in regular session via Zoom at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Lawrence Hoerman presiding and the following members of the City Council present: James Barber, Leon Birney, Tom Stoppel, Dylan Shotton and Jason Vaughn. Also present were City Attorney Lynn Koehn, City Superintendent Daylen Elsey, Sheriff Troy Briggs and City Clerk Jeannie Trigg. Visitors were Travis Webb, Brandon Webb, Kelsey Webb and Charity Horinek

The minutes of the last regular meeting was approved as distributed with a motion by Councilmember Stoppel, seconded by Councilmember Birney. The motion carried 5-0.

Brandon Webb and Travis Webb were present to discuss with the Council wastewater options on the Bloomfield Addition.

Sheriff Troy Briggs was present to give the monthly law enforcement report. He discussed Covid19, weather and accidents.

Superintendent Elsey gave the monthly water report. He discussed cost estimates from EBH Engineering for Wastewater to Bloomfield Addition. The Council discussed State Septic Tank regulations. A motion was made by Councilmember Vaughn, seconded by Councilmember Birney to allow Septic Systems in the Bloomfield Addition. The motion failed 2-3, Councilmember Barber, Stoppel and Shotton voted no.
