SUBLETTE, KS JUNE 7, 2021

The Governing Body of the City of Sublette, Kansas met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Lawrence Hoerman presiding and the following members of the City Council present: James Barber, Leon Birney, Tom Stoppel, Jason Vaughn and Dylan Shotton arrived at 7:03 p.m.. Also present were City Superintendent Daylen Elsey, Deputy Tiffany Gasseling, Attorney Lynn Koehn, Fire Chief Rusty Sherwood and City Clerk Jeannie Trigg. Visitors were Anna Unger and Woodrow Fanning.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were approved as distributed with a motion made by Councilmember Vaughn, seconded by Councilmember Birney. The motion carried 4-0.

Anna Unger was present to discuss with the Council getting water utility at the Bloomfield Addition. The Council approved proceeding with engineering and development at the Bloomfield Addition, which may include creating a special assessment district.

Woodrow Fanning was present to discuss a general nuisance. The Council requested that Superintendent Elsey address nuisances at 506 W Chouteau and 505 W Carson Avenue.

Deputy Tiffany Gasseling was present to give the monthly law enforcement report.

Fire Chief Rusty Sherwood was present to give the monthly fire report. He discussed the city tanker truck progress.

Superintendent Elsey gave the monthly water report. He informed the Council that we needed a new pool cover, he gave bids and specs. A motion was made by Councilmember Shotton, seconded by Councilmember Vaughn to purchase a pool cover not to exceed \$8500.00. The motion carried 5-0. He discussed the need for a building to put pool chemical in. A motion was made by Councilmember Vaughn, seconded by Councilmember Shotton to purchase an 8 x 10 building not to exceed \$2500.00 from Sublette Lumber. The motion carried 5-0.

Attorney Koehn discussed the Property Tax Revenue Neutral Rate.

Mayor Hoerman discussed with the Council the updates with CCLIP Grant Project 41-KA-5997-01

Mayor Hoerman informed the Council that Budget Work Session is July 6th at 5:30 p.m.

A motion was made by Councilmember Birney, seconded by Councilmember Barber to approve and allow payment of the bills as distributed. The motion carried 5-0.
