SUBLETTE, KS MAY 3, 2021

The Governing Body of the City of Sublette, Kansas met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Lawrence Hoerman presiding and the following members of the City Council present: James Barber, Leon Birney, Tom Stoppel, Dylan Shotton and Jason Vaughn. Also present were City Superintendent Daylen Elsey, Sheriff Troy Briggs, Attorney Lynn Koehn, Fire Chief Rusty Sherwood and City Clerk Jeannie Trigg.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were approved as distributed with a motion made by Councilmember Vaughn, seconded by Councilmember Shotton. The motion carried 5-0.

Sheriff Troy Briggs was present to give the monthly law enforcement report. He reported on the new speed sign on Highway 56.

Fire Chief Rusty Sherwood was present to give the monthly fire report. He reported on fire gear; \$6800.000 for two full sets. A motion was made by Councilmember Shotton, seconded by Councilmember Vaugh to approve the purchase of two sets of fire gear not to exceed \$7000.00 from Weis Fire & Safety Equipment. The motion carried 5-0. He reported on an infrared camera. A motion was made by Councilmember Stoppel, seconded by Councilmember Vaughn to approve the purchase of a TXS Thermal Imager for \$3356.65 from Bullard. The motion carried 5-0.

Superintendent Elsey gave the monthly water report. He reported on bids received for the Crack Sealer machine; the high bid was \$1200.00. A motion was made by Councilmember Vaughn, seconded by Councilmember Barber to accept the \$1200.00 bid for the Crafco Crack Sealer Machine. The motion carried 5-0. He discussed street sealing; purchasing oil and rock. A motion was made by Councilmember Vaughn, seconded by Councilmember Birney to purchase three truckloads of oil from Wright Asphalt at the cost of \$2.26 per gallon FOB. The motion carried 5-0. A motion was made by Councilmember Barber, seconded by Councilmember Shotton to purchase 900 ton of CMA gravel from Klotz Sand at the cost of \$13.00 per ton FOB. The motion carried 5-0. He discussed the water meters that broke during the cold spell.

Attorney Koehn presented the lease agreement with the County for the Burn Pit. A motion was made by Councilmember Barber, seconded by Councilmember Shotton to approve and sign the Burn Pit Lease from the County. The motion carried 5-0. He discussed the airport hangars.

Mayor Hoerman informed the Council that Budget Work Session is July 6th at 5:30 p.m.

A motion was made by Councilmember Birney, seconded by Councilmember Vaughn to approve and allow payment of the bills as distributed. The motion carried 5-0.

Councilmember Barber made a motion to adjourn at 8:09 p.m., seconded by Councilmember Shotton. The motion carried 5-0.
