SUBLETTE, KS OCTOBER 3, 2016

The Governing Body of the City of Sublette, Kansas met in regular session at City Hall at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Jery Bailey presiding and the following members of the City Council present: Lawrence Hoerman, James Barber, Leon Birney, Tom Stoppel and Dylan Shotton. Also present were City Attorney Lynn Koehn, Sheriff Troy Briggs, City Superintendent Daylen Elsey and City Clerk Jeannie Trigg. Visitors were Dixie Harlow and Scott Schneider.

Mayor Bailey opened the meeting with a prayer.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were approved as distributed with a motion by Councilmember Birney, seconded by Councilmember Stoppel. The motion carried 5-0.

Dixie Harlow and Scott Schneider, representatives of Victory 4-H Club, were present to address the Council about painting the 4-H emblem on Inman Street. National 4-H Week is October 2nd through October 8th. A motion was made by Councilmember Barber, seconded by Councilmember Hoerman to allow the Club to paint their emblem on Inman Street, to work with Superintendent Elsey on the project for safety. The motion carried 5-0.

Sheriff Briggs gave the monthly law enforcement report for the City. He informed the Council that Judge Steven Santala is on duty and working well. He discussed doing and happenings within the City.

Clerk Trigg reported that Southern Pioneer Electric/Hugs Program donated \$1,170.00 for the City Park trash receptacles.

City Superintendent Elsey gave the monthly water report. He discussed condemning the property at 304 Myrtle Street. A motion was made Councilmember Barber, seconded by Councilmember Hoerman to pass a resolution condemning that property. The motion carried 5-0. He discussed the time frame for completing the shop roof. He reported that the street sealing went well. He discussed the progress on the Inman Street Park.

A motion was made by Councilmember Hoerman, seconded by Councilmember Birney to approve and allow payment of the bills as distributed, with the exception of Truck Components to check on warranty before payment made. The motion carried 5-0, with

Councilmember Birney abstaining on Birney Construction and Councilmember Barber abstaining from Barber Sales & Repairs.

Councilmember Barber made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilmember Birney. The motion carried 5-0.
